
Libraries have always been one of my favorite places so in 1986 I obtained my Masters degree in Library Science from the University of Maryland. I have worked in both public, school and private/corporate libraries. Mysteries are my favorite genre but I will read almost anything! My favorite author is Madeleine L'Engle for both her adult and young adult fiction.



Author Q and A with member Mona R. Semerau

Tell us about your book and why you wrote it.

In writing *Forces*, I wanted to have a certain creative tension, a tone, to be evident that would provide an added dimension to the plot and characters of the story. My solution was to adopt a literary approach which would allow me to weave easily in and out of narrative and verse, making full use not only of wordcraft, but physical spacing to accomplish the effect I wanted. This is evident in the formatting of the



text and the introduction in places of outsized words and spatters, screaming sparrows and strutting Suns (*Me!*) to lend a hint of the graphic novel into what fundamentally has become an epic poem.

So it is not exactly a novel. I have described it as *poetic narrative* for lack of a better word, and can be defined as 'a mildly lyric, less snooty form of elevated prose.' As such, it comes with its own mythology, and even a riddle or two.

What part of the book was the most fun to write? This may seem odd, but discovering what it was about. And then discovering through trial and error how to achieve the multi-dimensional quality of the writing style. That was both fun and difficult, and grossly inefficient. Not the way to write a book, but it worked this time.

Which of the characters do you relate to the most and why? The principal character of course, because through her eyes I discovered the wonder that she felt. Each character had their strengths and charm. The most difficult were the Scorch'dlanders. They were more akin to a collective intelligence, and AI of sorts, and yet I had to force myself to flesh them out somehow to make them believable.

How would you describe your book's ideal reader? The book has been erroneously tagged by reviewers as Young Adult, but in fact an older readership would find greater enjoyment from its imagery. In many ways *Forces* was more 'crafted' than written, immersive fiction intended to be savored, perhaps some parts read through a second or third time, rather than tasked to one's reading list.

If you could spend a day with another author, whom would you choose? As far as I can remember I have always wanted to write, but I think the author that most influenced me in my earlier years was J.R.R. Tolkien. There is a quality in his writing that suggests a different time, a different world, for which he set the trend, and a moral element which is universal.


