Rack after rack, tray after tray, pie after pie, smile after smile all added up to nearly \$2,000 on Saturday, May 14 at the Friends of Stoughton Public Library annual Pie Place. It was great to be back in the Carnegie Room after a year at the Badger Theater and a year of no pies at all due to the Pandemic. And the crowds came back to share their appetites for tasty homemade treats. Fruit pies, custard pies, nut pies, and cupcakes tempted all who found their way to the table laden with slices of luscious goodness in clear single slice clear boxes.

The opening slice was sold at 9 am. Seven and a half hours later the last remaining piece of pie was sold at 4:30 pm. The unsold cupcakes were donated to the Fire Station staff nearby who were happy to keep the yummy morsels from going to waste.

Volunteers in the kitchen sliced more than 100 donated pies. Individual slices cost \$3.00 each and could be eaten onsite. In addition to pie, coffee, water, juice, and ice cream were available for purchase. Tables were covered with red and white checked disposable coverings. Books from the book nook were scattered on each table to provide not only reading materials, but as a reminder that books are for sale at the book nook any time the library is open.

Updated membership brochures were on hand for the convenience of visitors who chose to become a Friend on the spot (one person did) or take the information home and drop off or mail in their check.



Thanks to everyone who bought a piece of pie or two. And our appreciation to all the volunteers who baked and worked to make this event such a huge success.


Youth Book Review


